Clearwater R-1 Summer School 2016

Clearwater R-1 School is offering a summer school program packed full of fun, engaging classes for students entering Kindergarten through 9th grade in the 2016-2017 school year. Teachers will present reading, math, writing, science, and social studies through a variety of hands-on activities. The summer session will be held from June 1-28 on the elementary campus.

Breakfast/Lunch: All students will be offered free breakfast and lunch daily. Breakfast will be served starting at 7:30.

Transportation: Abbreviated bus routes have been developed for the summer session (see attachment). Parents, regardless where they live, may drop off and supervise their child until the bus arrives at any of the stops noted on the attached bus schedule or they may drop off/pick up at the school.

Incentives: Student attendance will be encouraged through the offering of incentives. Incentives will be awarded as follows:

- Perfect attendance (no minutes and/or hours missed) \$100
- Absent no more than 1 day (6.5 hours total) \$75
- Absent no more than 2 days (13 hours total) \$50

Mandatory Attendance: Students required to attend summer school due to poor attendance and/or failing grades must meet the following requirements in order to receive credit for summer school courses:

- Satisfactorily complete all work
- Miss no more than two days throughout the summer session

Students that are required to attend summer school are not eligible for attendance incentives.

Eligibility: Students entering Kindergarten through 9th grade in the 2016-2017 school year are eligible to attend. Residency restrictions do not apply to the summer school program; however, transportation is the responsibility of the parent.

Field Trips/End of Summer School Trip: A field trip will be planned for the last day of summer school for students entering 4^{th} - 9^{th} grade. Younger students will remain on campus and participate in various fun-filled activities. 4^{th} - 9^{th} grade students that do not have 100% attendance may be asked to pay a portion of their admission fee for the event chosen as the end of summer school trip. (Details will be provided as soon as plans have been confirmed.)

Enrollment: If you are interested in having your child attend summer school, complete the attached enrollment form and return it to either the elementary or middle school office. Please return the completed form as soon as possible. Class offerings are dependent upon student enrollment/attendance. Names of students that turn in completed forms to either office by noon on May 24, 2016, will be entered into a prize drawing. Two names will be drawn for two \$25 Wal-Mart gift cards on June 6, 2016. Winners must be present to win.
